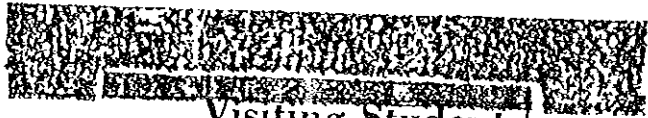

## Visiting Students Hear Kennedy

WASHINGTON.

President Kennedy told a business group from abroad yesterday that techniques that work in the United States are hard to transfer to countries without adequate manpower or resources.

But he added in remarks to 200 business trainees from 38 nations that during their stay in the U. S. they will "at least come to a better understanding of how things work here." The trainees were delegates to a congress of the Association for the International Exchange of Students of Economics and Commerce last week at Princeton University. Some 3,500 students worked on jobs in other countries last year under the sponsorship of the association.

"I'm confident that I'm talking to a lot of future prime ministers and presidents of your countries here," Mr. Kennedy said. "I just want you to know that when you come back in that role and the Kennedys are long gone you will be equally welcome."
